Making history and setting a milestone in the school's sports program, the boys of the U12 basketball team from Colegio Bilingüe de Panamá conquered the 2025 edition of the Copa Talento in their category. The CBP Wildcats convincingly defeated the Academia Hebrea team in the final game with a score of 58-51.

For the Wildcats, this victory carries great significance, as it marks the first championship they have ever achieved in the history of the Copa Talento. On offense, Javier De León stood out with 19 points, while Enrique Marsall contributed 15 points and 15 rebounds.

It is worth highlighting that, in addition to the team's strong collective effort, Javier De León was selected as the tournament's Best Defensive Player after finishing as the leader in rebounds and blocks. He was also chosen as a member of the tournament's All-Star Team.

Eduardo Obaldía de duodécimo grado destacó que desde pequeño ha participado en competencias internas de matemáticas, aunque reconoce que la OPM ha sido un reto mayor. Explicó que la clave de su preparación estuvo en la responsabilidad, la perseverancia y la honestidad, ya que “en la olimpiada uno debe ser consciente de que no se puede usar ayuda externa, y el reto está en confiar en las propias habilidades”.

RECYCLING INITIATIVES AT COLEGIO BILINGÜE DE PANAMÁ

Colegio Bilingüe de Panamá continues to promote environmental awareness through its recycling project in Secondary, encouraging students to take concrete actions to care for the planet. This initiative was launched thanks to Professor Laura, who, in her effort to provide meaningful and enriching activities, coordinated with a recycling foundation, organized the necessary documentation, and guided the team of teachers to implement the program.

The system consists of three color-coded and labeled bins for aluminum, plastic, and cardboard or Tetra Paks. The process is simple but requires discipline: students must deposit materials correctly, clean, and dry, preventing pests and material loss. Once collected, the materials are weighed and managed by the partner foundation.

According to Professor Emmanuel Michelangelli, the project serves a dual purpose. It fulfills the school's social and environmental responsibility while teaching students that their actions have an impact on the broader world. The habit of properly separating and disposing of materials fosters awareness about waste reduction and cultivates discipline and personal responsibility.

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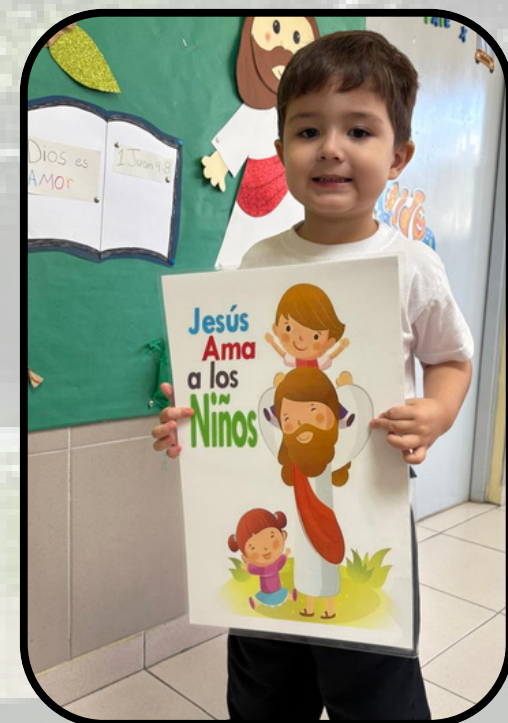

At CBP, we firmly believe that leadership goes beyond the classroom, and that each experience contributes to shaping confident, reflective students who are committed to their community and to their own learning.



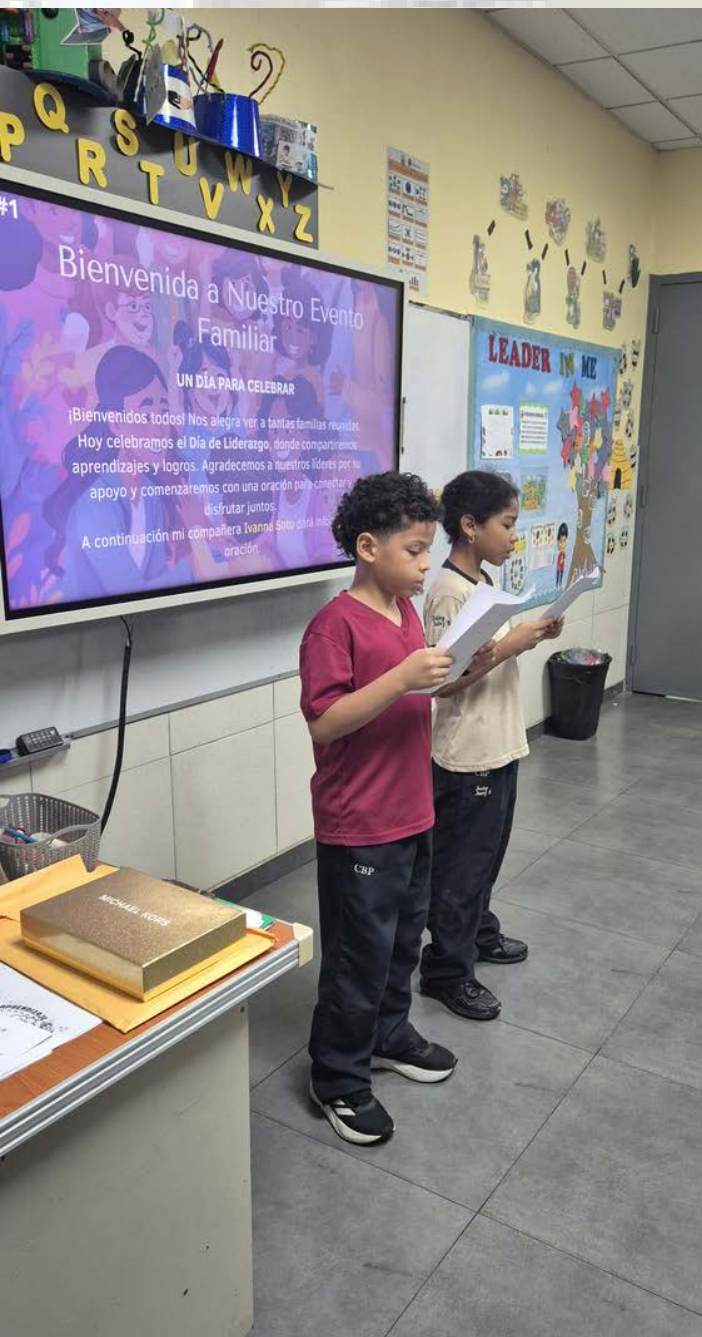


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LEADERSHIP WEEK IN CBP
